4. FIRST-AID MEASURES

Inhalation: Remove person to fresh air. If irritation or symptoms occur, get medical attention.

Inhalation of mists may cause respiratory irritation and symptoms similar to ingestion.

Indication of immediate medical attention and special treatment, if necessary: Medical attention is recommended for ingestion.

5. FIRE-FIGHTING MEASURES

Extinguishing media: Use any media that is suitable for the surrounding fire.

Specific hazards arising from the chemical: Product is not classified as flammable or combustible.
